


Annual Christmas Party

ELC Experience Being an Educational Leadership Consultant is unlike any other position I will ever have in my life. I remember when I left for my first visit to Theta Sigma at the University of Central Florida in August. I was so terrified for my first visit, but I quickly realized how much fun it is to mentor chapters overcome obstacles, perfect their recruiting skills, and become closer as Sisters. Healthy and thriving forests are vital to our community because they absorb and naturally filter rain water, produce clean oxygen, provide living spaces for wildlife, and create a place for people to connect with the outdoors. In order to help create healthy forests, work may include removing aggressive weeds (Ivy & Blackberry), maintaining areas post-removal, and planting trees and shrubs during the rainy season. Families including children are welcome (children under the age of 14 if accompanied by an adult).

<u>Wear</u> clothing that can get dirty, long pants and long sleeves (helps protect against prickly plants), sturdy shoes that can handle some mud (closed toed shoes are required such as work boots, hiking boots, rubber boots, etc. NO sandals, flats, or heels), rain gear and warm layers.

Bring a sack lunch and snacks, a full water bottle, a travel mug for tea/coffee.

Husky Football Ushers Needed - Support AXID

Alpha Xi Delta has been providing a team of ushers at the University of Washington Football home games for over 25 years. Many of our present and past ushers have been parents, aunts, and friends. Some of our past ushers have moved out of the Seattle area or retired after many years of service. We are looking to rebuild a per-game team of ten for the 2018 season. We ask for a commitment of at least 5 games out of the 7 home game season. Due to television/network challenges, we can only plan for a "call time" one week in advance. The event staff issues game by game information to keep up on the day's news. The job is easy and involves directing fans to where their seats are located and to provide a presence of authority. Along with normal duties, Ushers can watch the games from the Upper Deck on the North side. Ushers are responsible for observing fans for any safety issues that they then report to the Captain or Supervisor. The job pays the House minimum wage for a 6.5 - 7.5 hour day. Parking passes are provided, however we encourage car pools. Orca cards are issued for those who ride the light rail. This is a great way to give back and support AXiD.
