Meet the Board of WANC

In September of 2021, the Washington Associates of Nu Chapter (WANC) Corporation Board gained 3 new members: Alyssa Huff (Epsilon Kappa chapter) as President, Teri West (Epsilon Zeta chapter) as Vice President, and Meredith O'Connor Schwietzer (Delta Rho chapter) as Secretary. We are so pleased to have returning board members Paige Peacock (Nu Chapter) as



Treasurer and Kate Johnson (Nu chapter) as Design Director! Our 5 hardworking and dedicated board members have already implemented changes to both owned properties and are drafting plans for the future of Nu housing. We have room for 5 more general board members and welcome anyone with a passion for Alpha Xi Delta and Nu chapter! We can tailor time commitments to fit your availability. Filling our board to capacity enables better decisions via more diverse opinions and access to information. We meet ~8 times a year, and locations change depending on what works for everyone each month. This year we've dined at Mamma Melina, met at board members' homes, met virtually, and met at our annex. We're very excited for the coming years at Nu chapter and would love to have you on the board!

Corporation Apdate on Nu Chapter


We have 75 members that reside in our main and annex properties, as well as 41 members living out. The live-in fee is \$3,290 and live out is \$340 per quarter. Our combined properties can sleep 116 women, so we're at only 65% of capacity. There are two reasons for low live-in numbers. 1) UW has changed their dorm policy and will not permit those joining sororities to break their contract, so half of PC '21 live there. We anticipate this to grow as in ~5 years

UW will push for all freshmen to live in the dorms. 2) Due to COVID-19, many juniors were granted live out status.

Due to the significant decrease in occupancy, we have struggled financially but this has not hindered our ability to make necessary changes to improve both properties. In the summer of 2021, we removed all carpeting from the second and third floors of the main house and installed hardwood. In the fall of 2021, we removed the carpet on the back stairway at the main house and refinished the existing hardwood. There is no longer any carpet any main house living space (more sanitary!). Both houses were upgraded with smart TVs equipped with all the popular streaming services (Netflix, Hulu, HBO, Disney Plus, etc.) instead of cable TV.

Due to the increasing safety concerns and an uptick in crime around UW, we installed new flood lights around both properties to increase the amount of light at night. Each Nu member was given the choice of either pepper spray or a personal safety alarm, and we added security window-bars to some of the less-secure windows at the main house including the first floor windows of the main house (as many do not lock securely anymore). In June of 2022, new energy efficient windows equipped with safety glass will be installed and look similar to the windows that were installed on the main house's upper







In winter of 2022, annex bathrooms received a cosmetic improvements. We are currently working on plans for improvements at both houses that meet the standards of UW Greek life to keep Nu chapter housing competitive. Programs Chair: this position is currently occupied but will be open for transition during August 2022. Our programs chair plans our scholarship fundraisers, Founder's Day, Alumnae Ceremony (UW graduating seniors), and events with Nu chapter such as Pandemic Pals and Alum Aunts. Keep in mind that this position collaborates with the entire board, divides up tasks and delegates to the board, and has support with each event. Monthly alumnae meetings are critical to this role.

Thanks for Scholarship & Fundraiser Support

We appreciate all of you who have given so generously in response to our postcards and outreach in the past year!

The spring postcard (left) raised over \$1200 for scholarships at a time we



couldn't gather for our traditional Pickle Mix event. In addition to funds from before, we were able to award \$1800 in scholarships to outstanding Nu members for fall quarter!

Our latest postcard (right) has raised nearly \$1900 in funds to be split between Nu Chapter scholarships and facilities' safety enhancements like fire escapes and new windows with better locking mechanisms (never painted)!
